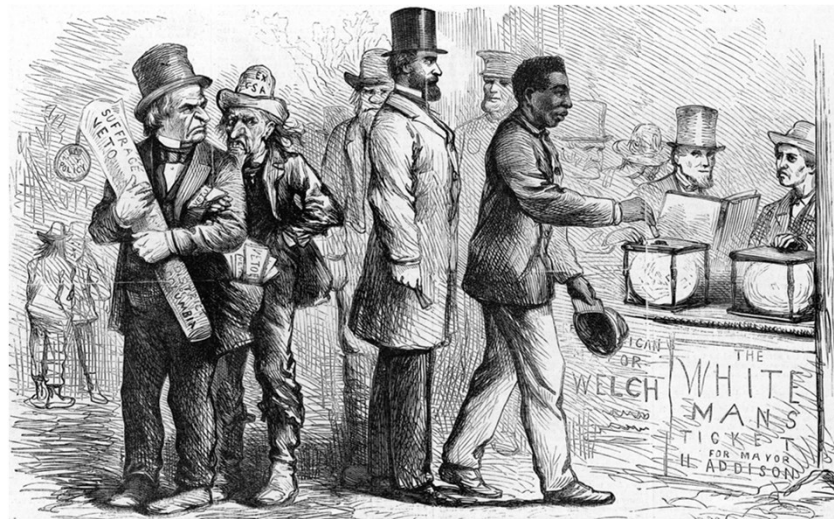



What impact did the 14th Amendment have?
